



Preparing For Whole-structure Fumigation with Master Fume™ Gas Fumigant

Preparations Before Fumigation Begins

Discuss the treatment program in advance with your pest management professional so you understand the procedure and what you need to do. There are some preparations that you will need to make, including bagging food and other items, removing pets and plants, and arranging for lodging. Carefully follow the instructions you are given about what items are to be removed from your home.

Stay out of your treated home until it is cleared and safe for re-entry. If you are concerned, ask your pest management professional to review the procedure of how your home was aerated and approved for re-entry.



If you have specific questions about your fumigation, refer to documents provided by the fumigator or call the fumigator listed on the warning signs posted on your structure. Bagging Food and Other Items

Bagging food and other items in special Master Fume™ Bag, Nylofume® or Fumiguard bags is an essential step when preparing for whole-structure fumigation with Master Fume. Your pest management professional will discuss with you the exact steps you will need to take.

Reduce the Bagging Process By:

- Use food and beverages in opened containers
- Donate extra food to local food pantries



Temporary Relocation

While your home is being treated with Master Fume gas fumigant, you will need to stay at another location.

Possible Locations for a Short-term Stay:

- Visit relatives
- Plan a vacation
- Visit local events and attractions



Removing Pets and Plants

Your pets and plants will need to be removed.

Possible Locations for Pets or Plants:

- Leave your pet with a friend
- Ask friends to “babysit” your plants and offer to do the same for them the next time they travel
- Discuss with your fumigator what preparations should be made for large fish tanks and terrariums that cannot be removed during the fumigation

- Ask your neighbors to watch for any strangers or unusual activity
- When possible, take your small valuables with you (i.e. Jewelry)
- Ask your neighbors to ensure their children and pets stay away from the fumigation site
