MSMA 6.6 AND MSMA 6 PLUS.....CURRENT LABEL ONLY

Current Label MSMA has the following registered uses:

- cotton with no active ingredient (a.i.) load restrictions or buffer zones
- broadcast use on golf courses
- sod farm use with no a.i. load rate or buffer zone restriction
- residential use including athletic fields, lawns, playgrounds and parks
- forestry application and non-bearing fruits and nut trees
- drainage ditch banks, fence rows, storage yards, and pipeline, railroad, highway ROW's
- certain grasses grown for seed

IMPORTANT DATES:

December 31, 2009 ...

- a. Manufacturers or registrants will stop sale of the above label in all states in the U.S.
- b. Inventory in the hands of manufacturers and registrants must be re-labeled.
- c. A manufacturer or registrant can no longer ship MSMA into the state of Florida except for the counties designated for cotton use.
- d. Distributors and dealers can continue to stock and sell the above label until December 31, 2010 and it does not have to be re-labeled at this date.
- e. Distributors and dealers can continue to transport MSMA into the state of Florida until June 30, 2010. Exceptions are counties designated for cotton use.

December 31, 2010

- a. Distributors and dealers must discontinue sale of the above label MSMA.
- b. Inventory in the hands of distributors and dealers must be re-labeled in most states.
- c. In the state of Florida, all MSMA in the hands of distributors and dealers must be removed from the state except for the counties where cotton is grown. Inventory in distributor/dealer hands in those counties must be re-labeled.
- d. The grower or end-user can use the above label MSMA until December 31, 2010.

December 31, 2010

- a. Any product already in the hands of users can be used legally until they are exhausted, provided that such use complies with the EPA-approved label and labeling of the affected product.
- b. In the state of Florida, the only remaining legal use for MSMA will be for cotton.

MSMA 6.6 AND MSMA 6 PLUS.....NEW LABEL USES ONLY

New Label MSMA has the following registered uses;

- cotton with a.i. load restrictions and buffer zones
- spot treatment use on golf courses and limited application on new courses
- sod farm use with application limits and buffer zone restriction
- highway ROW's with application limits and buffer zone restriction

IMPORTANT DATES;

January 1, 2010...

- a. Manufacturers or registrants' MSMA inventory in the U.S. must carry the above new label in all states in the U.S.
- b. Inventory in the hands of distributors and dealers can be either current label MSMA or new label MSMA.
- c. Distributors and dealers can continue to stock and sell this label until June 30, 2013.
- d. In the state of Florida, only cotton will remain a legal use in certain counties.
- e. Manufacturers or registrants can no longer ship MSMA into the state of Florida except for counties designated for cotton use.

July 1, 2010

- a. In the state of Florida, all MSMA must be removed from the state except for the counties where cotton is grown. In those counties, distributors and dealers can continue to stock and sell the above label on cotton only.
- b. The grower or end-user can use the above label MSMA until December 31, 2013.

DESIGNATED COTTON AREA in Florida ... Calhoun, Columbia, Escambia, Gadsden, Hamilton, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Suwannee, Walton and Washington counties.

These are the important dates to be addressed at this time. In 2013, the MSMA label will change again and be limited to only cotton, UNLESS the OAP Taskforce is successful at getting another review by EPA of the MSMA label. More information will be forthcoming.
